Moving from Homelessness to Permanent Housing

+262

more unsheltered residents reached this month than in October 2021

91%

increase in interim shelter beds by 2023 compared to 2019 733

formerly homeless households moved into permanent housing since October 2021

Housing Authority Rental Assistance Programs

87% of HACSM's 5,000+ vouchers assist Extremely Low Income and formerly homeless households

Rental assistance awards over previous 12 months

- Received and leased-up 222 Emergency Housing Vouchers for homeless households
- Received and now leasing-up 41 Mainstream Vouchers for homeless and at-risk households
- 15 Foster Youth Independence Vouchers just awarded for homeless and at-risk former foster youth
 - = 278 homeless or at-risk households quickly housed

County Housing Voucher Program

In March 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved **\$4 million in Measure K funding** for a **new County Housing Voucher Program**.

Program Goals:

- Keep rents deeply affordable for approximately 100 formerly homeless households.
- Support housing retention by providing access to intensive supportive services.

County Housing Voucher Program:

- Program limits rents to 30% of tenant's gross income.
- Tenants have access to on-site intensive support services free of charge.
- Ongoing 15-year program, subject to biennial Board appropriations.
- 2023 Launch






